Module 3 asks you to reflect on your current assessment practices and set goals to incorporate authentic assessments into your course. You will see examples of rubrics, feedback tips and culturally responsive approaches to assessment design, such as Indigenous perspectives on assessment. You will also develop a dynamic strategy to help learners develop real-world skills as they reflect on their development in your online course.

How do we engage online learners and keep them motivated? It is often easier said than done. In Module 4, you'll explore how communication and technology pave the way for thoughtful and engaging digital experiences. By better understanding the unique qualities of your course, you'll be better equipped to transform your online course into a transformative learning community.
