

Analytic Rubrics

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Analytic rubrics break down the characteristics of an assessment into parts with a range of scores possible for each characteristic.

Advantages:

- Gives learners a clearer picture of exactly where they succeeded and where they have more work to do.
- Allows the grader to give more targeted feedback.

Disadvantages:

- Takes a lot of time to create. Descriptors for each category must be developed.
- Learners might not engage with all the feedback. Analytic rubrics can offer an overwhelming amount of information.
