I wish to share with you a few points of reflection I have gained from Day Two's panels. In relation to the governance and system re-engineering panel, Dr. Bruce Kidd positioned our safe sport dialogue within a long and complex story of sport in Canada and through the notion of resistance, noted most reform initiatives face pushback and uneven change but at every stage marginal and excluded groups have sought opportunities and fair treatment. Dr. Peter Donnelly called out the separateness of the sport sphere, its governance, its autonomy, and claimed that while this has constrained reform, it is now time where athletes are rising and Dr. Gretchen Kerr challenged us to flip the lens by moving from a prevention of harm stance to an optimization of experience stance.
