Before the Royal Notaries in Louisbourg Isle Royale were present Sieur Blaise Cassaignoles merchant and inhabitant of this town And Jean Baptiste Cupidon, free negro established established at ??? ????, who made the following agreements and conventions namely that the said Sieur Cassaignoles gives freedom and hereby frees the named catherine negresse her slave and this from this day and forever without any restrictions, for the said Catherine to be freed and from servitude and free of her will as if she had never been enslaved; to do and dispose of herself as she wishes; and the said Cupidon because of the marriage that he is contracting with said Catherine; promises and commits himself to pay and give, for the said liberty and emancipation, to the said Sr Cassaignoles ??? or assignee, and this in solidarity With the said Catherine, here present and accepting The amount of five hundred *livres*, payable As of one hundred and twenty pounds that the said cupid has at present paid and given in current cash in the presence of the said Notary to the said Cassaignoles of which the latter holds him quit and discharged him and any other; the sum of eighty

Livres during the month of September of the present year; the sum of one hundred livres at the same time next year seventeen hundred and fifty-four; the same amount of one hundred livres in the month of September of the following year seventeen hundred fifty-five and the remaining hundred livres at the same time of the following year seventeen hundred and fifty-six; for the security of the payment the said Cupidon and

and Catherine, have hereby affected and mortgaged themselves and generally all their movable and immovable property present and to come, by means of which the said Sr Cassaignoles has completely relinquished and vested of his rights, authority claim and property that him or his assignee could have on the said Catherine; Wanting her to enjoy plainly and peacefully of a complete and free will, which will not be disturbed in any way, either by him or any other, the said Sr Cassaignoles pledge to the said negresse as done and passed at Louisbourg
