

Sale of the enslaved Creole, named Jacques  
11 October 1757.

Before the Royal Notaries in Louisbourg  
Isle Royale Undersigned was present Mr. Guillaume  
Delort Advisor to the Superior Council of  
this Isle named X as representing the ship's captain  
Sr. Villard, who hereby sold Ceded left and transported  
from now forever with a General Guarantee  
to Mr Pierre de LaCroix troop commissioner  
in this Colony, Residing in this  
city at this present and accepting, purchaser for  
him and the said Sieur a *negro* named Jacques,  
Creole of Martinique and belonging to the said Sr  
Villard, the purchaser saying (????)  
to know him. This present sale made  
for the sum of eight hundred *Livres*  
paid Cash before these present to the said Sir Delort as  
Recognized by him as acquittance,  
whereby the seller transfers all rights of  
property that the said S. Villard had of the said  
*negro*, in favor and for the benefit of the purchaser, for  
him x the said Sieur to enjoy and disposed as  
in his other property, for this purpose the said *negro* has been  
delivered in its protection every discharge  
done and passed at the said Louisbourg in the study of one of the  
said Royal notary in the year seventeen hundred and fifty  
seven on the sixteenth (?) October before noon X have  
sign; reading done
