## Familiar Consonant Shape Practice

[p]	Remember you don't need the serifs at the bottom of the p's "descender"
[b]	 No hook needed at the top of the b's "ascender"
[t]	 My preference is to have a slight hook on the bottom of the [t] so that there is a difference between it and the "barred L" symbol [ɬ].
[d]	 This is really simple
[k]	 Notice how the upper diagonal is made first, and then the lower diagonal comes off it.
[g]	 This is a "single story", which is noticeably different from the "double-story" version often used in typography "g".
[s]	 Don't make a script "s", as in "ə"
[z]	 Don't bar your "z", as in "z"
[f]	 No serif needed at the bottom
[v]	 Keep the bottom of the v pointy
[m]	 No serifs needed on the m's "feet"
[n]	 Same with the n
[l]	No loops needed, but make sure it is tall enough. Sometime people make them so short they start to look like some of the vowel shapes, most notably, [ɪ]. Don't go past the baseline or else it becomes a pause mark [ ].
[w]	Keep the points at the bottom sharp (a double-V rather than a double-U).
[h]	 Keep it simple
