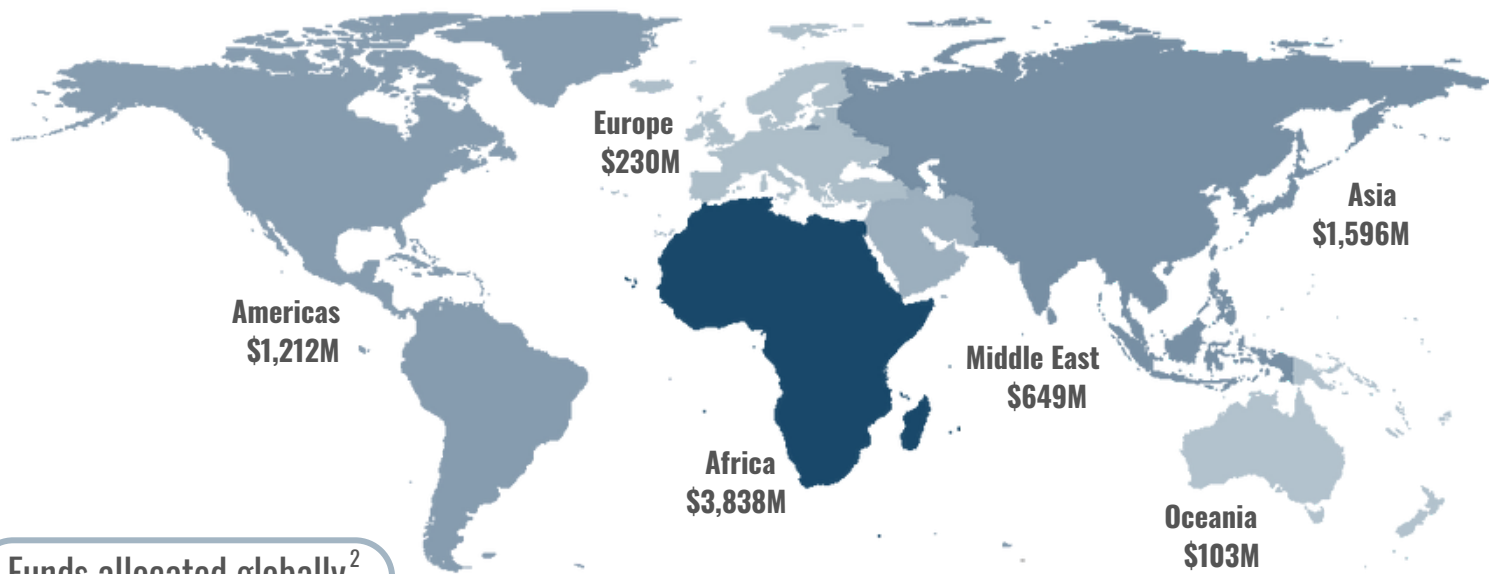

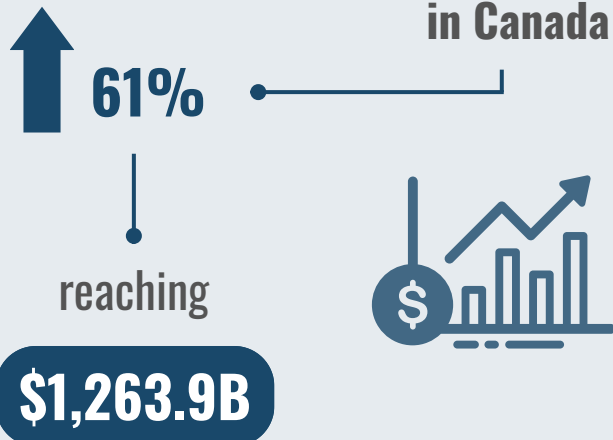
Between 2015-2022,

Canadian direct investment abroad



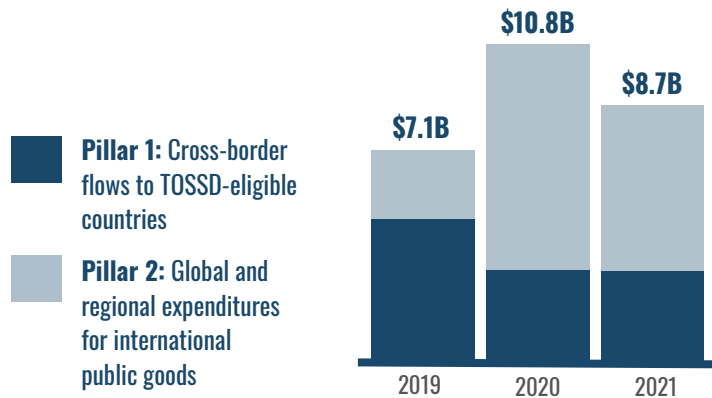
Between 2015-2022,
