

"Alone on Valentine's Day"

(jazz improv)

This improvisation can be accompanied with a straight eighth soft rock style or perhaps a gentle latin style rhythm guitar. The basis for this tune is an beautiful old jazz standard which is often played in a ballad style. Tasteful slurs are up to the player. Pencil them in if need be. Use a closed fingering on this melody.

Medium Latin
