

# Chords Studies in "B" Minor

Some chords will require a partial "bar" fingering. Guitar players tend to grab for a large bar chord fingering when they see the chord symbol. While this may often work quite well, it is prudent to practice fingering only the presented notes. A "wall of sound" is not needed here. The lines in the fingering suggest a "guide" finger from one chord to the next. Other fingerings are possible.
