

# Arpeggios in the Key of C Minor

The arpeggio and chord studies in this book are not intended to be absolutely exhaustive examinations of the possibilities. Most of these studies use only the principal chords of the key in question. A more thorough exploration of the harmonic possibilities will follow in the subsequent volumes of *Guitar Fundamentals*.

The arpeggios are as follows:

- Line 1:** Cm (Fingering: 1, 3, 4, 1, 3, 4) followed by Fm (Fingering: 2, 1, 3, 1, 3, 1) and C I.
- Line 2:** G7 (Fingering: 0, 0, 1, 0, 1, 0) followed by Cm (Fingering: 1, 1, 0, 1, 0, 2).
- Line 3:** Fm (Fingering: 3, 4, 1, 1, 0, 1) followed by Cm (Fingering: 1, 1, 0, 2, 1, 4).
- Line 4:** G7 (Fingering: 4, 0, 3, 2, 0, 1) followed by Cm (Fingering: 2, 0, 1, 4, 2, 0) and C I.
- Line 5:** B $\flat$ 7 C I (Fingering: 4, 1, 3, 1, 1, 1) followed by E $\flat$  (Fingering: 2, 1, 3, 1, 4, 1).
- Line 6:** B $\flat$ 9 C I (Fingering: 1, 1, 1, 0, 1, 2) followed by E $\flat$  (Fingering: 2, 1, 3, 1, 4, 1).
- Line 7:** G (Fingering: 1, 2, 4, 3, 4, 5) followed by Cm (Fingering: 2, 1, 3, 1, 1, 1) and C I.
- Line 8:** Dm7b5 C I (Fingering: 0, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1) followed by Cm (Fingering: 4, 1, 0, 2, 0, 1) and G7 (Fingering: 4, 2, 0, 1, 0, 1) followed by Cm (Fingering: 2, 0, 1, 4, 2, 0) and C I.

Choose an appropriate picking formula that makes good "string logic." The string order favours a glide picking method.
