## Octave Scales on the "B" and "E" Strings

## BASIC FINGERING DEVICES:

Every scale begins on the second string and requires only one position change in one direction. Determine the starting finger in the same manner as in the five tone scales.

1. Change position on the "B" string in both Ascending and Descending direction.
2. Change position on the " $E$ " string in both Ascending and Descending direction.
3. Ascending change on the " B " string and Descending change on the " E " string.
4. Ascending change on the " $E$ " string and Descending change on the " $B$ " string.

Starting with the scales marked with the asterisks, these three scales may be played in two ways:
On the "E" string alone, or on the "B" and "E" strings combined. (In actual fact, five different ways.) In the future, these will be called UNISON SCALES, meaning that they can be played in more than one way and in more than just one place.
