




We are curious. We are creative explorers who approach all that we do with a learning mindset. We cultivate space for reflective practice and critical thinking.


We are helpful. We share knowledge and help literacy educators use technology in innovative ways.. As we learn from the people we work with, we amplify their knowledge and skills.





The AlphaPlus definition of Blended Learning

Blended learning is an approach where educators leverage technology and digital access for learners to create, communicate, collaborate and apply critical thinking skills to construct knowledge in a connected world.

The 4 Cs of blended learning

Be Creative.

Multimodal learning (visual, auditory, textual) and demonstrations of knowledge provide learners with choices that support and enhance their strengths and preferences.

Example: Project-based approaches employ creativity-based digital technologies through design, photography and video production.



Participating online as a more active poster, commentator, developer and collaborator helps learners build their networks.

Example: Students' mobile devices are key communication tools that can be used in a variety of ways inside and outside the class.



Collaborate.

Involve learners in the planning and decision-making processes about what, where and how learning will happen.

Example: Online notebooks, websites and classrooms (e.g. Evernote, Google Sites, Moodle or Google Classroom) support collaborative planning by organizing and managing resources and providing opportunities to work together.

Critically Analyze.

Helping learners critically analyze information for relevance and trustworthiness builds learners' confidence in navigating and evaluating online environments.

Example: Understanding information privacy helps learners establish security routines when engaging with online services.

4 building blocks of blended learning

Create

- Learners create original works or repurpose, remix or mash up digital resources into new creations.
- Learners build knowledge by exploring real-world issues, developing ideas and theories and pursuing answers and solutions.
- Learners set learning goals and use technology to customize their learning environments to support their learning.

Communicate

- Learners express themselves creatively for a variety of purposes and audiences using the platforms, tools, styles, formats and digital media appropriate to their communication goals.
- Learners bring their authentic selves to learning and communication and have opportunities to communicate with authentic audiences.

Collaborate


- Learners use digital tools to broaden their perspectives and enrich their learning by collaborating with others including peers, experts or community members.
- Learners and instructors collaborate to create learning paths and design learning opportunities that meet learner needs and help them realize their dreams.

Critical thinking

- Learners critically curate a variety of resources using digital tools to construct knowledge, produce creative artifacts and make meaningful learning experiences for themselves and others.
- Learners explore the rights, responsibilities, ethics and opportunities of living, learning and working in a digitally connected world.


