# **HOS2243 Written Report Instructions**

**Deadline:** Submit your written report by 11:59 PM the night before the next class after your leading effort.

**Purpose:** This report combines a summary of what occurred in class with your final decisions after receiving feedback from your classmates. It is a team effort, not an individual essay.

# **Steps to Complete Your Report:**

# 1. Compile Notes:

 After your Leading Effort, gather all your notes into one document accessible to all team members.

#### 2. Create a Word Document:

- Use any system to draft your report, but the final submission must be in Word format.
- You can use online tools like Word Online or Google Docs for real-time collaboration.

## 3. Report Elements:

- Title Page: Include the title of your case, due date, and names of all participating team members. Exclude names of non-participating members; they will receive a grade of zero.
- Table of Contents
- Page Numbers: Number all pages after the table of contents.
- Citations and References: Use in-text citations and include a reference section.
- Font: Use a consistent font type and size (Times New Roman, Arial, or Calibri in 12pt).

### 4. Required Sections and Headers:

### Case Background:

 Provide a summary of the case study and explain what your team and class are tasked with. Do not list the tasks; give an overview of their purpose.

#### Previous Learning:

 Outline the relevant courses and specific learning that your classmates believed could be utilized in your case.

- Explain why your classmates believe this learning was applicable.
- Include a paragraph stating whether your team agrees with the feedback and why. If you believe your classmates missed a course, seek to mention the additional relevant course or learning.

# Required Tasks:

- Use sub-headers with the exact wording of each task from your case
- Summarize the feedback received in class for each task in 1-2 paragraphs.
- Provide your team's final decision and rationale, supported by research or previous learning.

# o Reflection of Leading Effort:

- Reflect on your strengths and weaknesses during the Leading Effort
- Suggest improvements for future leading efforts.

#### References:

- Include 2-3 references supporting your rationales from the "Required Tasks" section.
- Use APA format for the reference list.

#### 5. Review:

Check for formatting, spelling, and grammar errors before submitting.

Any findings of Academic Dishonesty will be dealt with in accordance to the AA48: Academic Honesty Policy of Algonquin College. A report will be filed with the Academic Integrity Office in which the entire team will have to meet with them. The entire team may be penalized for this.

While AI is being permitted to be used to brainstorm and plan the Leading Effort, it is strictly prohibited to be used for the Written Report.
